

**Samuel I. Stupp, PhD**

Professor Stupp earned his Ph.D. in materials science and engineering from Northwestern University in 1977. In 1999, he returned as member of the faculty at Northwestern. Dr. Stupp is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and fellow of Biomaterials Science and Engineering, World Biomaterials Congress, American Physical Society, American Association for the Advancement of Science, and World Technology Network. In 2001, Dr. Stupp chaired the review of the National Nanotechnology Initiative at the request of the White House Economic Council. His awards include the Department of Energy Prize for Outstanding Achievement in Materials Chemistry, the Materials Research Society's Medal Award for his work on self-assembly, and a Paris Sciences Medal for his lectures at Ecole Supérieure de Physique et de Chimie Industrielles in Paris. In 2004, he was the Merck-Karl Visiting Professor of Organic Chemistry at MIT, and also visiting professor at the Institut de Science et d'Ingenierie Supramoléculaires in Strasbourg. In March of this year, he will receive the 2005 American Chemical Society Award in Polymer Chemistry.
